#### **RECYCLING**

North Castle is required to recycle paper, plastics, glass and metal. **All items must be placed loose** in clearly marked recycling bins.

Do not place recyclables in any plastic bags. Recycle bins are available for purchase at the Town Clerk's Office. No plastic bags can be accepted within recycling. For Town online updates go to northcastleny.com.

### How do I know what plastics are recyclable?

Look for the chasing arrows recycling symbol located on the container. It must contain a #1 through #6. Only bottles and jars displaying these symbols are recyclable and accepted.

### CURBSIDE/BACK DOOR TRASH COLLECTION

- Back door service is available for a monthly fee.
- All waste and recycling must be available by 7:00 AM on collection days.
- Household trash must be brought curbside in solid containers, maximum capacity 32 gallons, equipped with suitable handles and a tight fitting lid.
- Waste and recycling containers may not be stored where they are visible from the street.
- Waste and recycling containers cannot be left on the street.
- Waste and recycling containers shall not be placed at the curb any earlier than 4 PM of the day prior to collection and must be removed no later than 12 hours after collection.
- Back door collection will only be made when driveway is free of snow, vehicles and other obstacles.
- Only the driver can determine if the driveway can be negotiated safely.

### PAINT CANS MUST BE SOLIDIFIED (TOTALLY DRIED OUT) THEN CAN BE PLACED IN REGULAR GARBAGE

#### **Bulk and large item pick up:**

- Residents must call Suburban Carting at 1-800-273-9394 before placing items at curbside.
- Bulk and large items must not be wider than 3 feet.
- Must be at the curb by 7:00 AM.
- Shall not be placed at curbside earlier than 3 days prior to your pickup day.
- No bulk pickup during holiday weeks, limited to 4 cubic yards per pickup.

#### **CHRISTMAS TREES**

Christmas tree pick up shall be performed by the Highway Department seasonally, pursuant to a schedule established by the Highway Department.
